Dear Parents,

As a school we are committed to working in partnership with you and we would like to keep you fully informed about all that we do. We are therefore taking this opportunity to let you know about some of the things that will be happening this term in your child's class.

Attendance & Punctuality

It is vital that your child is in school every day and on time at 8:25am. Lessons start promptly after they arrive at 8:30am and if they miss the beginning, it is very difficult for them to catch up. It is therefore important that the children are punctual as learning begins straight away.

If your child is not coming into school, please report this absence on Studybugs or by calling the school office. If we do not hear from you, we operate a first day calling policy in order to safeguard our children.

Main aspects of the curriculum

This term we will be working on the following aspects of the curriculum. We encourage you to support your child in their learning at home.

<u>English</u>

Reading:

Your child should bring their book and reading record into school every day.

You can support your child by hearing them read every day and discussing the book and vocabulary. The more practice that pupils undertake, the more fluency and stamina they will have. Please refer to your child's Reading Record for guidance on how to help them progress with their reading. We will be keeping a track of how often your child reads and this will be reported back at parents evening with the expectation that they read <u>a minimum of three</u> times a week.

Reading books will be changed when your child has finished their book but this must be indicated in their Reading Record.

Reading lessons this term will be focused around the following texts: The Firework Makers Daughter – by Phillip Pullman Tamarind and the star of Ishita – by Jasbinder Biland Viking Voyagers – by Jack Tite

Lessons will focus on the following skills:

- Fluency
- Word meaning
- Retrieval
- Inference
- Prediction
- Summarising
- Authors use of language

Writing:

Writing in year 4 will be focused around the following texts: Frindleswylde by Lauren O'Hara and Natalia O'Hara The Selfish Giant by Oscar Wilde The Lion and The Unicorn by Shirley Hughes Odd and the Frost Giants by Neil Gaiman

Children will write for a range of purposes and will focus on a variety of different writing skills as set out within the national curriculum.
