Headteacher's Comment:

Dear Parents/Carers

After a successful and very busy first week back, it has been great to enjoy a calmer second week where the children have been really focused on their learning. Leading assembly today and seeing how respectful, responsible, and reflective the children were truly struck a chord with me. It highlighted just how much Hogarth has moved on in such a short time, creating a great environment for both children and staff alike.

The children have also represented the school superbly. They visited the Houses of Parliament with Mrs King last week, where they were highly commended by the guides and the parents who accompanied them. I would like to thank all of the parents who have come forward to support the children during Aspirations Week by delivering speeches and supporting the activities that Mrs King has organised. It is so important for children to learn about the opportunities they can embrace in the future and to understand what the world of work may look like for them.
