

Headteacher's Comment:

Dear Parents and Carers,

Last week, we were delighted to conclude a successful Ofsted inspection. It provided a fantastic opportunity to showcase the progress our school has made over the past few years. I would like to thank you for your positive comments following last week's newsletter—it's clear that you, too, recognise and value the positive changes we've worked hard to achieve.

I'm pleased to share with you some of our academic achievements from this academic year, for the children who have been formally assessed:

- EYFS Outcomes: Our Early Years Foundation Stage results have improved from last year, reflecting the strong foundations being laid in our youngest learners.
- Phonics Screening: The results are incredibly positive, particularly in the number of strong readers within the cohort. Remarkably, even if the national threshold had increased from 32 to 34, we would still have recorded the same high pass rate.
- Multiplication Tables Check: Our children performed exceptionally well, with both the average score and the number of pupils achieving 100% increasing from previous years. This puts them in a strong position as they move into upper Key Stage 2 maths.

To top off what has been a truly successful year, our SATs results were published this week. We've seen a significant improvement in outcomes, with our combined Reading, Writing, and Maths score increasing by 7% compared to previous years. There is also the potential for this figure to rise further, pending the outcome of some appeals we have submitted.

I could not be prouder of the progress, attainment, and opportunities our children have experienced over the last couple of years.

Next week, many of our Year 6 pupils will be heading off on their residential trip. I wish them all a fantastic time and encourage them to take good care of the staff who have generously volunteered their time—ideally by going to bed at 7:00 p.m. and enjoying a solid 12 hours of sleep! Huge thanks to Mrs Carey, Mrs Higgs, Mrs King, and Mr Yexley for making this experience possible.

Finally, a gentle reminder: we have recently had an increasing number of children being collected late from school. While I understand there have been occasional last-minute club cancellations and traffic issues any child still waiting in the office after 3:30 p.m. will be taken to after-school club, and charges will likely be applied to ParentPay accounts. Your cooperation in ensuring prompt collection is greatly appreciated.
