Headteacher's Comment

I can't believe that we are already in December and in the lead up to Christmas.

This week has provided me with the opportunity to speak to a number of parents, on both a professional and personal level. These conversations have really helped me to take the time to reflect on how we praise the successes and achievements of both the children and the school. It is very easy to publish attendance and reading data, to show what isn't happening at Hogarth and how this needs to improve for the benefit of our children. Our attendance is at 92%, which is 3% below the Primary national average, and only two classes have reached over 50% in their reading this week. These results, I'm sure you will agree, aren't good enough. I must, however, mention that our attendance is currently 8% above last year and that the reading percentages are moving in the right direction. I am desperate to award the reading trophy and class 100% attendance awards but alas, this opportunity hasn't presented itself yet.

On the other hand, we also need to reflect, praise and thank those families and children that do read every night at home, that do bring their children in to school daily and adhere to the vison and values of Hogarth. I want to assure you that those children that read and attend school regularly receive positive praise from their class teachers, behaviour points towards their awards and additional extrinsic and intrinsic motivators that help them to understand that their efforts are valued. We have £20 book vouchers to raffle off for children that have 100% attendance and those children will also be sharing hot chocolate with myself.

As parents, we also need to see that the work and support from home goes a long way to the progress and achievement that our children make at Hogarth. Having two boys myself (aged 9 and 11), I understand the stresses of homework and reading but always manage to find 10 minutes a night to listen to my boys read.

At a recent course I attended, we were informed that children spend less than 20% of their year in school so it is vital that we all understand the role we have to play in helping our children succeed. If the school can help you in any way to promote reading or attendance, or you have any ideas, please bring your ideas to us on the gate at any time.

How can reading at home every night with our children help them?

- 1. Their vocabulary is larger and more extensive.
- 2. They perform better academically.
- 3. Their imagination can run wild.
- 4. Their creativity skills develop.
- 5. They develop empathy.
- 6. They gain a deeper understanding of their world.
- 7. Their concentration levels improve.
- 8. The parent and child bond improves.
- 9. Their cognitive development is supported.
- 10. Their social skills and interaction improve.


