Maths and Resilience

In the UK, we tend to have a negative attitude towards maths. How many times have you heard, 'I can't do maths' or 'I don't have a maths brain'? Probably quite a lot. Now think, how many times have you heard, 'I can't read' or 'I don't have a reading brain'? Probably never. However, maths is an important life skill, just like reading, and here at Hogarth, we aim to give our children this skill to help them with their onward education and their future as adults.

For our children to succeed in maths, we first need to change this negative way of thinking about maths and, yes, that goes for teachers and parents' mindsets too!

Hogarth is now working closely with the Venn Maths Hub in Essex (funded by the Department of Education) and the National Centre for Excellence in Teaching Mathematics to develop and build an ambitious, coherent maths curriculum for our children. We are undertaking extensive training to deliver a 'Mastery' approach to maths. The attitude that underpins this approach is – children are neither born with a 'maths gene' or 'just no good at maths'; all children can succeed in maths given sufficient time; and with good teaching, sufficient resources, effort and resilience, all children can achieve in and enjoy maths.

With this approach in mind, teachers will be encouraging the children to learn from their mistakes in maths and to never give up, building their resilience, which is a life-long skill. We aim to change their mindsets towards the subject so that they can enjoy it and reach their full potential.
